1.2. Public Works Superintendent

- The Public Works Superintendent informed Council that Staff are currently working on funding applications for the Baker Court sewer rehabilitation.
- Council was provided with an update on the turn lane across from Melody Lane.
 It was noted that based on the weather and other factors, the wall construction will most likely not be completed until Spring 2017. The Public Works
 Superintendent noted that he will be reaching out to the City of Guelph for a copy of their construction evaluation form, in order to evaluate the contractors work and progress of the project.
- Council was informed that Parking restrictions are now in effect.
- The Public Works Superintendent brought up the issue of By-Law enforcement. The CAO indicated that she would include a 'By-Law' line on staff time sheets.

3. Planner's Report

3.1. Allocation Policy

The Planner presented the Allocation Policy to Council. The Planner noted that local developers and municipal lawyer have provided comments on the policy. Council was informed that the policy would be brought forward to the next regularly scheduled Council meeting for approval.

3.2. Update on ongoing files

The Planner provided an updated on ongoing development files. Moco Farms have received the Transportation Master Plan and are evaluating the impact of the proposed arterial road through their development. Corseed will most likely provide a redesign of their proposed development, given the changes proposed in the Transportation Master Plan.

Comments have been provided by Burnside for Phase 3 and the Town expects
Thomasfield Homes to review their proposal and submit with few changes. The Planner
noted that she expects that a Public Meeting will be held for all three proposals (Moco
Farms, Corseed and Thomasfield Homes Phase 3).

Council further discussed the possibility of developing an aging in place facility. The Planner echoed the estimate of the Town's Engineer that there would be approximately 39 units of allocation available at the Wastewater Treatment Plant. Council discussed potential locations of the facility, noting that there are alternative sites available.
